Alasia Clean & Green Commission President- Clean and Green Commission came to see how the Youth Commission works, with a possible idea to bring their own commissioners along to witness a Hayward Youth Commission meeting. Anyone is welcomed to come along to the Clean & Green Commission meetings. Volunteers are wanted as well as an event happening on 1/17/26 for a clean up event where any volunteers are appreciated. 6:41 GUEST SPEAKERS

Norma Dib YEP - Bridge To College (YEP). Bridge to College as well as Youth Advisory Committee (YAC). Bridge to College is an amazing and local program that essentially allows students in 7th - 12th grade to attend/do college level classes that gain college credits as well as exposing students to how college will be like with an opportunity like this. Allows students to take general education classes like theater(i.e.). As well as everything being free for students taking these courses. Currently called Dual Enrollment, as students who've taken these classes have an overall 25% increased rate of high school graduation since they've been exposed to what the average college class is supposed to be like. As well as being able to receive better overall scores on tests/assessments. As currently 7th graders will be eligible to enroll/do in Dual enrollment during the spring time with a 2.0 GPA minimum in order to be eligible for attending. As well as there being online Dual enrollment classes for high schools only. As

after each class is completed, there are college credits that are earned. As a majority of classes have transferable credits. As for the process of being able to begin enrolling into these classes, there are about 2-3 applications that are required to do beforehand/to do in order to attend these classes.

The YAC is the youth advisory committee is a program for elementary - middle school students, but high school students can join the committee that overviews this program. As it empowers young students by allowing them to speak out on issues within their school that they feel that is impacting the school and how they shall fix them through projects. As on April 18th, there will be a showcase showing these ideas that each of the participating schools have done. Youth Commissioners are given the privilege to aid these students in their presentation as well as there being an event for the students here in the City Hall.

Sabrina Aranda - Hayward Unified School District, as well as the League Of Women Voters. The League of Women voters is a nonpartisan political organization that provides voting education as well as providing advocacy as a nonpartisan political organization. That also does action and advocacy. As this program has allowed students in Oakland Youths to vote with the ages voting for their school board was 16 & 17 year olds as they obtained this through their own campaigning. To join this, there is a process in order to do this, the first step being communicating with the city council about this. The Hayward Youth Commission has been provided with the courtesy of being the first group that the League Of Women Voters has spoken to about this thrilling opportunity as the HTC also is backed by the largest recreation park district as well.
