6:36 PUBLIC COMMENTS



6:50 GUEST SPEAKERS

Ray Bonilla, currently part of the Hayward City Council, was previously a HYC commissioner. He wanted to share what inspired him to become a commissioner. In his youth, he lived in a garage in his youth and he saw that communities pull together in times of need. Community service was the only resource that he and his family could utilize when he was younger. Thus, fighting for and ensuring the rights of people's access to resources such as these was a passion for him when he was younger. Nobody from his high school had been on the Hayward Youth Commission for the past five years. Filling out the application for the HYC was very difficult for him since he didn't have much access to many resources (his parent's first language was Spanish). Thus, he reached out to the resources he knew he had. He went to the library and the librarian helped him, and he was eventually accepted! At first, the HYC didn't have much order, and thus he is the reason as to why the HYC has leadership roles today. He was the



chair of the HYC for four years. Solving problems requires us respecting each other and figuring out the process that benefits the most people, and the HYC provided him the opportunity to train those skills. As he grew older, he reached the age limit to which he could be on the HYC, however he still wanted to help. He ended up applying to the Community Service commission. This commission utilizes a couple million dollars towards problems that the city faces. Then, he decided to apply for the Planning commission. Even though he knew nothing about planning, he wanted to answer questions such as "how can we make sure that utilities are built in a place that benefits the most people." He was on the Planning commission for 7 years. Then, he had the opportunity to join the Hayward city council. He wondered how he could make sure that he fought for all of the people while on city council: housing, homelessness (how can we quickly be able to get people out of that situation), if it wasn't for the garage that his grandparents have, enriched community services (how do we make sure community services are there when we need them the most), how can we make sure that we are addressing the most pressing issues in our community? The third thing that he said he wanted to address was public safety (how well our streets are lit, how well are we to respond to disasters) In all of his roles that he's been in, the thing that enabled him to be successful was his ability to collaborate. One doesn't necessarily have to be the smartest. But we will all make it if we're moving the city together. Those abilities to move things forward and collaborate (which he trained on Youth Commission) are what enabled him to be so successful till today. As a tip, he wants the HYC to be the fire that leads us to do good later on in his life. Even though he is occupied with being on the city council, he has a full time job on the side as well. 7:10 AGENCY AND TASK FORCE UPDATES

City of Hayward: Mayor Salinas reciprocated Council Member Bonilla's message. For those who don't live in Hayward, there is a program called the concurring enrollment, meaning that you can go to any high school and take chabot college level classes. These are UC and CSU transferable classes. Then he spoke about what's been happening in Washington. Families and kids are being caught in the middle of politics. Today, the tactics and strategies are a lot more aggressive as in federal military and federal agencies like ICE and Border Patrol being directed to come into cities like Hayward to perform aggressive immigration tactics. In the city of Fremont, ICE and Border Patrol were going into a neighborhood doing door knocking checks. People and families who did not know their rights opened their doors. In this fear, he hopes that the commission he wants to remind us that we are a sanctuary city, which means two things: 1. The city invests in educating families on what their rights are 2. It clarifies the role of the Hayward Police Department, to protect us, our families, and our neighborhood regardless of citizenship status. Thus, when someone calls 911, the city does not ask about immigration status. We do not work with or help immigration agents. The harsh reality of this is that he cannot as a mayor prohibit federal agents from coming into this city.

Approximately \(^2\)3 of the commission received a bike from the Hayward rides event. The program's goal is to hand out 2000 bikes. The mission is to create a generation of youth in Haywrd that will choose a more environmentally-friendly mode of transportation. As you may have noticed, there are more bike lanes being painted now. The idea is for pedestrians, bikes, and cars to coexist, with pedestrians and bikes being the priority. Over the years, there have been too many deaths related to

pedestrian and car accidents. One tragic accident was with Lydia Guerra, a teacher who sadly passed away on Calaroga Avenue.

HARD: Recreation Supervisor Noel shared details about multiple HARD service events. Reach out to him or check the slideshow (from Larry) for the details. Director Hatcher wanted to reciprocate what Council Member Bonilla spoke about, especially the lesson about having connections. Especially when Ray has just shared his email now, we should take advantage of that opportunities like those/

HUSD: This year, this group will continue supporting student attendance. They thought that students aren't motivated to come to school due to a low self esteem. They will try to fix this by adding fun activities and school and tools to support student's grades, such as a mentoring program.

HARD: This group hopes to host more events this year. They will host the night market again they will be advertising these events in the social media more, passing out flyers around school
