WORK SESSION

1. Universal Residential Design Ordinance: To Review and Discuss Various Policies Tied to the Adoption of a Universal Residential Design Ordinance for the City of Hayward.

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Planning Manager Lochirco presented a PowerPoint presentation for the analysis of the potential Universal Design Ordinance. The Universal Residential Design Ordinance is a project on the Strategic Roadmap. Planning Manager Lochirco has worked with the Building and Housing Divisions to evaluate Universal Residential Design Ordinance options and to develop a proposal to submit to council. The Universal Design Ordinance is recommended for ensuring housing is more accessible to all by utilizing an ordinance to have certain criteria the developers must use when building homes in Hayward. The main benefits of the ordinance are, eliminating expensive retrofits, allowing residents to age in place, and inviting a more inclusive living environment. Planning Manager Lochirco requested feedback from the committee members regarding specific elements of a potential Universal Residential Design Ordinance

2. Discussion on the Simplification of the Tenant Relocation Assistance Ordinance (TRAO).

Ayush Patel, Management Analyst I, presented a proposal to simplify the Tenant Relocation Assistance Program (TRAO). The presentation outlined the layers of complexities that have made the TRAO difficult for stakeholders and staff to administer. The proposed modifications include simplification of the relocation assistance payment structure, cross referencing applicable state law, cross referencing defined terms shared by the Residential Rent Stabilization Ordinance, implementation of a fee for appeal hearings along with a corresponding hardship policy and changing assessment and appeal hearing process to be consistent with other departments.
