RESOLUTION APPROVING AND APPROPRIATING THE COMMUNITY AGENCY  
FUNDING RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026 IN THE  
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) ECONOMIC  
DEVELOPMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE CATEGORY

WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 makes funds available to qualified cities for certain community development activities, and the City of Hayward is qualified to receive certain funds pursuant to said act; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered public testimony and the CDBG Program recommendations prepared by staff and the Community Services Commission, a copy of which is attached and hereby referred to for further particulars; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered the environmental impact of the program and hereby finds and determines that the program is composed of projects that are categorically excluded from the National Environmental Protection Act or will be subject to later environmental review and finds and determines that the activities funded by the program are either not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act or will be subject to later environmental review; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Hayward hereby approves and appropriates the Community Agency Funding CDBG Economic Development and Infrastructure recommendations for Fiscal Year 2025-2026 as shown in Exhibit A, in a total amount not to exceed \$922,018 which is incorporated by reference herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that except as may be otherwise provided, any and all expenditures relating to the objectives described in the Community Agency budget are hereby approved and authorized and payments therefore may be made by the Director of Finance of the City of Hayward without further action of City Council.
