





COUNCIL VACANCY PROCESS LEGISLATIVE BUSINESS

LB 22-026



Background

- November 2022: Election for Mayor and two City Council seats;
 Councilmember Mark Salinas elected Mayor, leaving a vacancy in his remaining term
- Vacancy runs from December 2022 through December 2024
- City Charter Section 501 requires the Council either fill the vacancy or proceed with a special election within 30 days following the occurrence of the vacancy
- Special Election would occur as an all-mail ballot election to be held on May 2, 2023

Proposed Council Member Appointment Timeline

Council Meeting to approve appointment process Dec 13 Issue Notice of Vacancy/applications available Dec 14 Applications due to City Clerk by 9am Jan 3 Special Council Meeting: Accept applications and Jan 3 confirm interview process Council select up to 5 applicants to interview/City Jan 5 Clerk notifies applicants Special Council Meeting: Interviews/Swearing in of Jan 9 new member OR Council directs City Clerk to call

for Special Municipal Election

Fiscal Considerations

 Special all-mail ballot election would cost between \$9 - \$11 per registered voter

• Estimating 80,000 registered voters, the cost to the City would be \$720,000-880,000

Recommendation

That the Council adopts a resolution affirming the process for filling the unexpired term of Council Member Mark Salinas and calls for a Special Election if the appointment process is unsuccessful.
