






### **Community Survey Insights**


- Instrument Development Process:
  - June 2023 Steering Committee Retreat
  - July 2023 Steering Committee Meeting
- Outreach and Collection Process: Word of Mouth, RC Reunion Picnic, Listserv, Online and Phone Surveys, plus Mail-In Options
- Purpose of the Survey: To share key findings and illustrate the current sentiments and desires of the Russell City community and its descendants for reparative justice.
- The sample size for the Russell City Community Survey was 377 respondents.









### Visualization of Impacts





#### Types of Emotional or Psychological Distress from Relocation




## Word Cloud of Community Priorities for Reparative Justice



# Sentiments on Reparations and Initiatives

- "Highly publicized acknowledgement of wrongdoing."
- "Permanent Historical physical accounting by Russell City Residents and Descendants about what happened, how it affected them and/or their families and what they feel the solution would be to prevent a reoccurrence of this travesty in Hayward."
- "Create a Community development fund; create a dedicated fund to support & develop minority-owned businesses; legal initiatives, support state legislation to address broader injustices like environmental racism and forced relocations."
- "Have a Russell City Day in Hayward including schools to teach children re Russell City."
- "Return the naming of streets to their original names when Russell City existed."
- "Designate an area, i.e., commemorative gate and list the family names of those who were forced out of Russell City."
