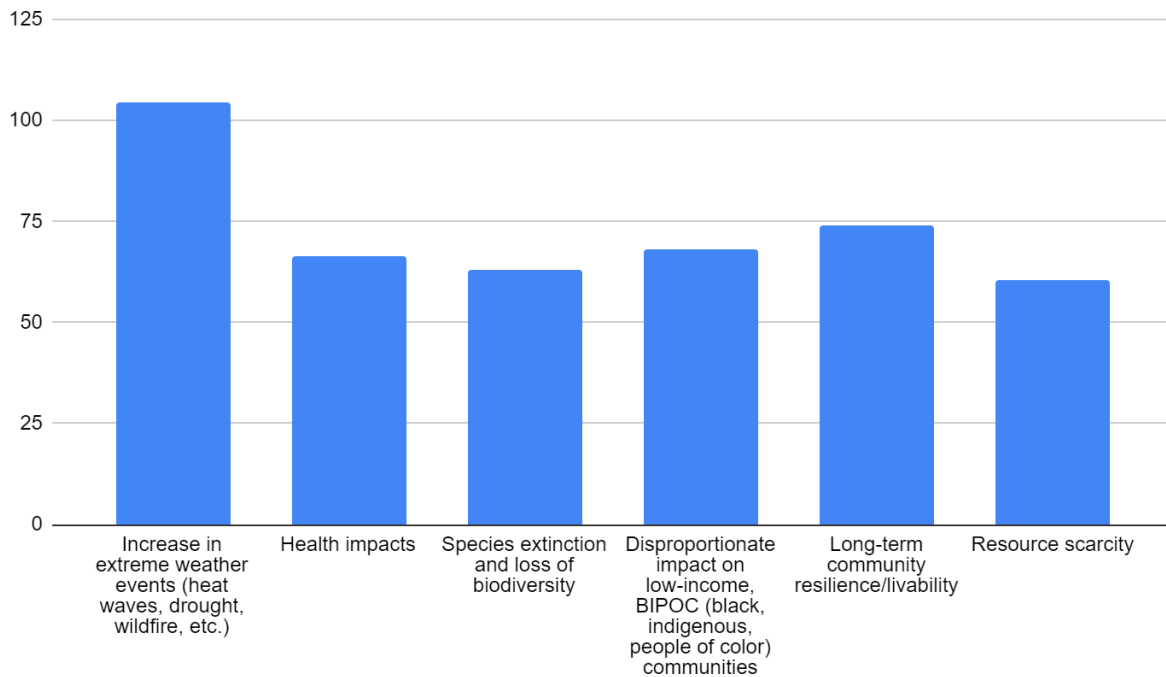

What concerns you most about climate change and greenhouse gas emissions?

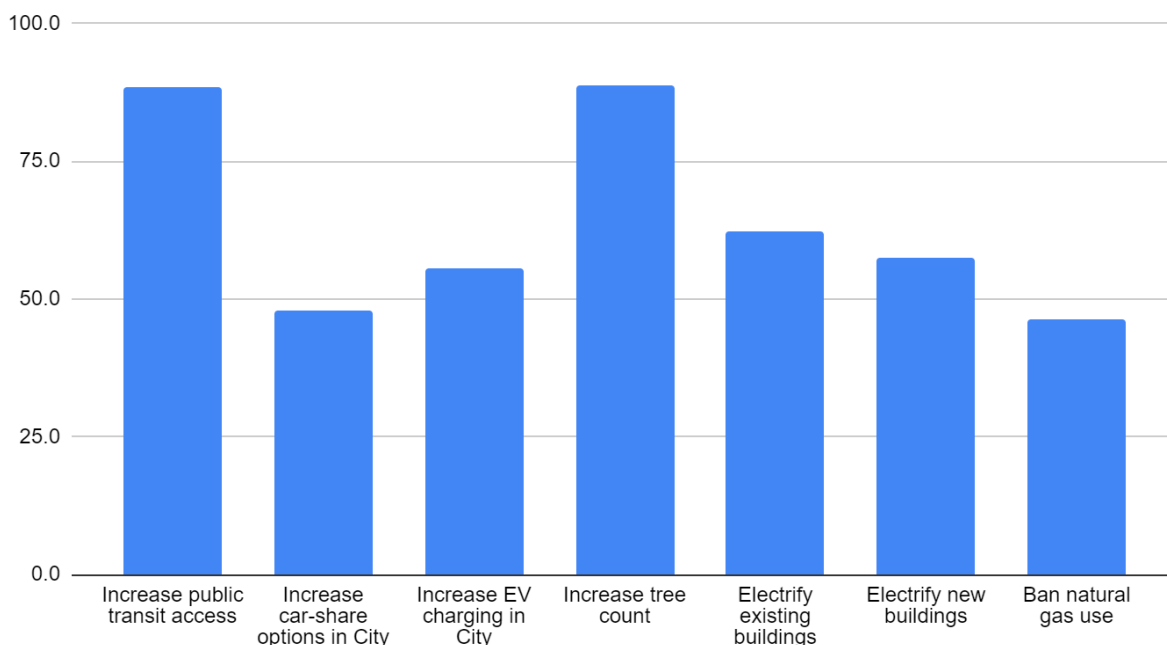


What do you consider the City's most effective tools for change?

Which sectors do you believe should be prioritized in the CAP?



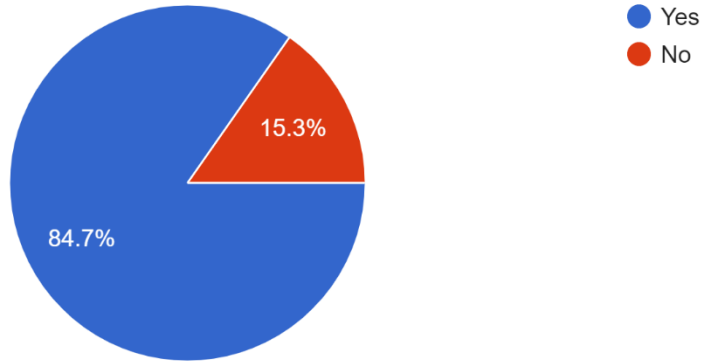

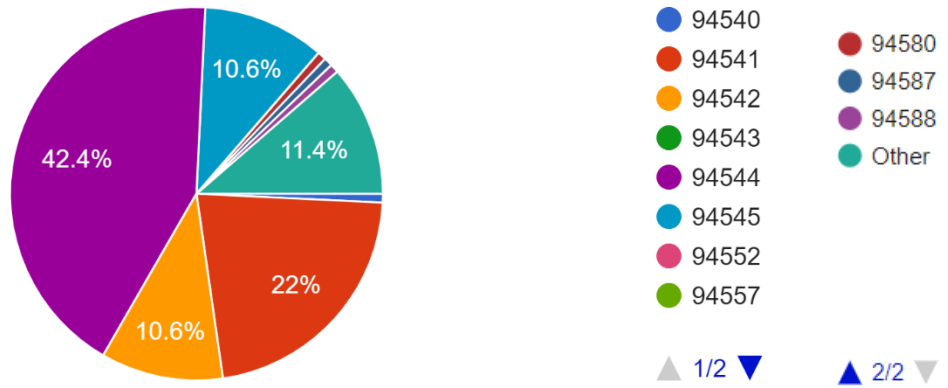
Do you currently live in Hayward?

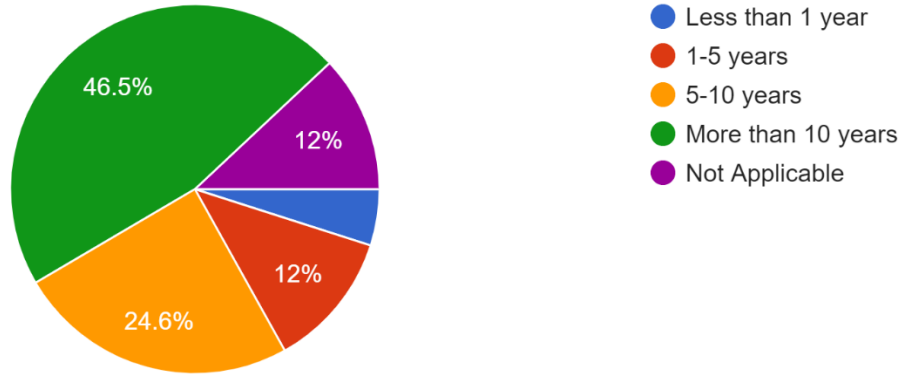
Which zipcode do you live in?
