6:50 BROWN ACT, ATTENDANCE POLICY, AND MEETING STRUCTURE

Micheal Lawson, City Attorney, spoke about the Ralph M. Brown Act.

Ralph M. Brown Act:

California law regarding open meeting rules/standards:

No secret meetings are allowed to be held

No electrotonic devices during meetings, no texting/emailing commissions or businesses outside of a public meeting. Quorum must be present to start and continue meetings

Meetings should allow for full discussion by all member and members of the public are entitled to speak The general public should be able to know and discuss what our meetings are about.

California Public Records Act:

The Public Records Act requires public access to most records generated by public agencies, including the Youth Commission. No reason or justification has to be given to make a public records request. Emails, texts and reports are considered public records.

This establishes a connection between the Commission and Commission members as this section requires that no less than 75% of all regular meetings be attended by the Commission members. If 25% of meetings are consecutively missed, then Commission members may be taken off the board, and if this were to occur. 7:45 SACRAMENTO FIELD TRIP DISCUSSION

Last year at the Sacramento Field Trip, The Commission had the opportunity to talk to Senator Wahab and experienced what it's like to be in a voting room. The commission was also able to take a tour of the Capital building.

The stipend for Food & Souvenirs was \$30 in previous years.

Commissioners suggested these ideas for the next Sacramento trip:


