GROUNDSKEEPER I

DEFINITION

To perform semiskilled and routine groundskeeping tasks in the care of landscaped areas.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

Positions in this class are distinguished from those in the class of Laborer, in that a Groundskeeper I usually performs more of the semiskilled tasks associated with groundskeeping as opposed to the more routine tasks. However, Groundskeepers I may often be required to perform duties similar to those performed by Laborers.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED

Supervision is normally provided by a <u>combination of a Tree Trimmer</u>, <u>Groundskeeper III</u>, <u>Groundskeeper III</u>, <u>Landscape Supervisor</u>, and <u>Landscape Manager</u>. <u>Tree Trimmer or Groundskeeper III</u>. <u>Groundskeepers I may provide working lead direction to other co-workers as assigned</u>. SUPERVISION EXERCISED

Groundskeepers I may provide working lead direction to other co-workers as assigned.

EXAMPLES OFESSENTIAL DUTIES

Depending upon assignment, duties may include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Drives water trucks and waters lawn areas, trees and median strips.
 - 2.—Climbs and trims small trees.
 - 3. Sprays lawn, shrubs and trees with fertilizer, pesticides or growth retardants.
 - 4. Cuts lawns, using hand mower or power mower.
 - 5. Trims and edges around walks, flower beds and walls using clippers and edging tools.
 - 6. Prunes shrubs and trees to shape and improve growth, using shears.
 - 7.—Clears areas of leaves using rake or blower and removes debris.
 - 8. Plants grass, flowers, trees and shrubs.
 - 9. Waters lawn and shrubs during dry periods using hose or by activating fixed or portable sprinkler

systems.

10. Cleans out drainage ditches and culverts, using shovel and rake.

Applicator's License in at least one category within one year from date of hire.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Essential duties require the following mental and/or physical ability to: work in variable indoor and outdoor conditions; tolerate exposure to outdoor elements in all weather conditions (e.g. heat, cold, and rain) throughout the year; work in confined workspaces, and be able to tolerate some exposure to varying amounts of vibration and equipment noise, pesticide chemicals, gas, oil and PVC glue and mechanical hazards; frequent standing and walking and occasional kneeling, crouching, stooping, twisting of the upper body, climbing; handling equipment; digital dexterity; perform repetitive hand movements and fine coordination to prepare documents and data using a computer keyboard and mouse/trackball; sit for prolonged periods of time; ability to safely lift and move equipment weighing up to 80 pounds; converse by telephone, email, in person and be clearly understood; read and comprehend technical and complex documents; and interact with the public and all different levels of City staff in an effective and professional manner. Essential functions must be performed with or without reasonable accommodation.
