# Budget Status Update from 11/18 Council Direction

Item	Estimated Amount	Status
Transfer/loan of funds from Measure C (\$3.85 Million is loan)	9,750,000	Complete
One-time transfers in/transfers out	1,900,000	Timeline mid-January
Anticipated one-time revenue & recovery from taxes and deposits	1,500,000	Business Tax audit started   Property Transfer Tax from Southland Mall not yet received   Developer Deposits under accounting review

\* Personnel related items including additional vacancies and overtime reductions, end assignments for temporary employees, MOU changes, changes to reduce overtime, City Council and unrepresented employee salary changes, and voluntary separation incentive program, layoffs, and other separations were merged into a single line.

In the interest of ensuring the City maintains a balanced budget for FY 2025-26, staff is also working to identify \$2 million -\$4 million in additional measures to provide the City with a one to two percent operating contingency for unforeseen needs or issues over the next six months.

- **Revenue Enhancements:** Explore possible revenue measures:
  - Business license tax review and ballot measure

- **Expenditure Reductions:** Consider structural, program and service changes
- **Accountability:** Review of draft Budget Policy and recommendations on long-term plans for certain funds impacting General Fund
- **Policy Direction:** Council discusses and provides direction for FY26/27 and beyond

## PURPOSE:

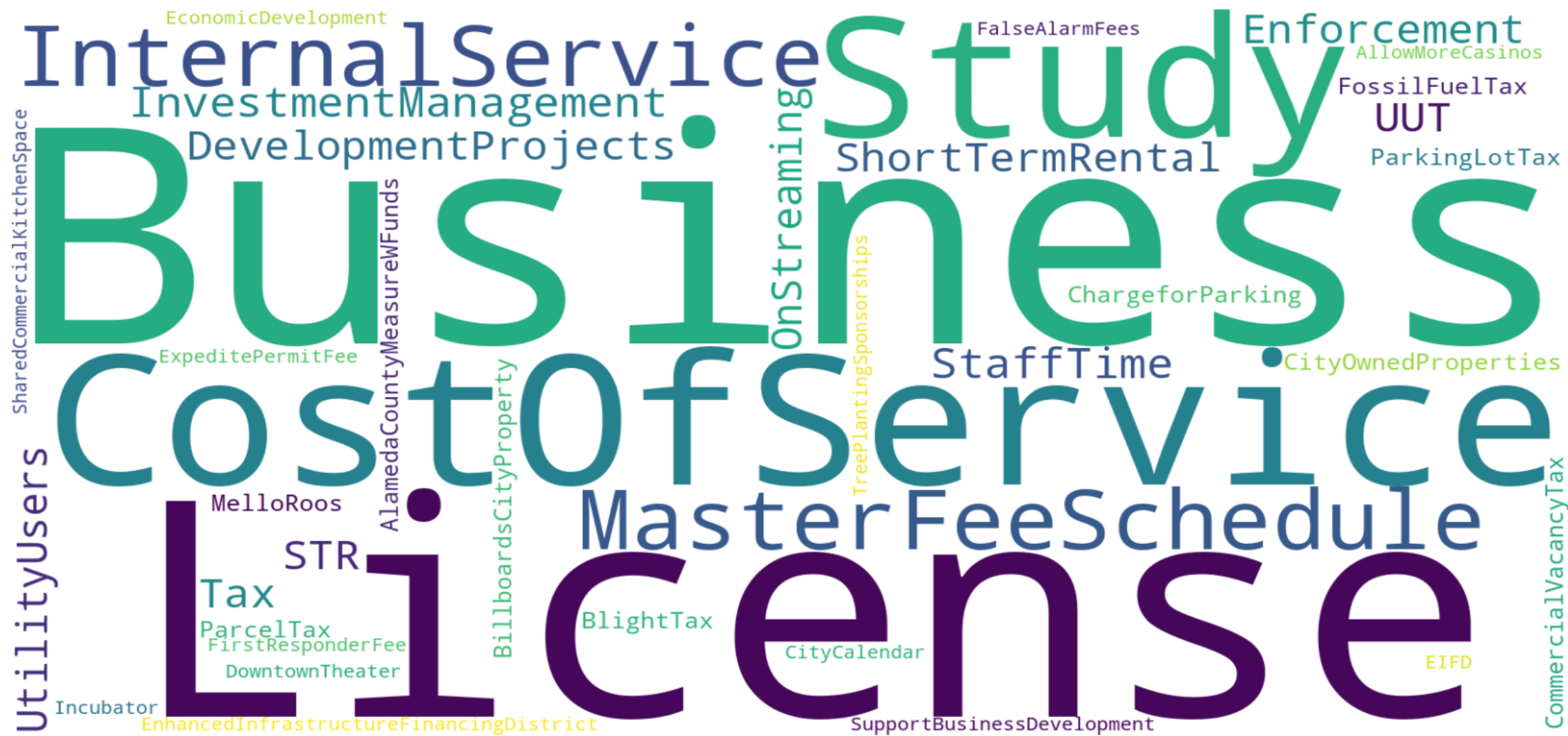
- To help the City attain and maintain financial sustainability & accountability
