#### **Recommendation and Background**

- Recommendation: restripe Hayward Blvd from Campus Dr to Farmhill Rd to 2 lanes (1 in each direction), add bicycle lanes, continue design of pedestrian crossing improvements
- <u>Feasibility Study</u>: Create a safer corridor for pedestrians, bicyclists, transit, and motorists
  - 2019 2021 Draft Feasibility Study put on hold due to staffing issues/community feedback
  - 2024 2025 restart project, refocus on safety and near-term implementation opportunities




#### **Engagement**

- Current engagement activities
  - February CIAC meeting
  - April meeting for CSU East Bay students/staff
  - May public meeting held at CSU East Bay
  - Coordination with Fire Department
- Feedback
  - Strong preference from community to retain existing capacity
  - Concerns about emergency evacuation
  - General recognition of the speeding/safety issues



#### **Hayward Blvd Speeding Concerns**




#### **Proposed Restriping**

Wide outside lanes




Buffered lanes both directions (for evacuation)





Retain capacity at approach to Campus Dr








Speed markings on steepest part of corridor





- CAL Fire provided updated Fire Hazard Severity Maps in February 2025
- Updates have been provided to the City of Hayward and the Fairview Fire Protection District, highlighting areas that are under the jurisdiction of local fire departments, called "Local Responsibility Areas", or "LRA's"
- These updates are unlikely to affect homeowner's insurance
- The Hayward Fire Department will use the map data to assist with fire monitoring and suppression efforts
- The City collected public feedback via the city website from March 19 through April 30th
