



Active Construction Projects – Commercial/Industrial










Building Permit Activity Summary

- Overall building permit activity (permits submitted and issued) has increased in 2023 over activity in 2022
- Many big projects are under construction or nearing completion (Mission Village, Depot Rd Community Apartments, Bellara Senior Housing, SoMi, Pimentel Place).
- Additional big projects starting (Eden on PG3).
- Delays by PG&E will have an impact on projects
- Staffing shortages may also be an impact (down 4 inspector positions)



Code Enforcement Activity: 2022 vs 2023





Code Enforcement Activity Summary

- New code cases and case closures do fluctuate overtime and are dependent on complexity
- Community Preservation Ordinance Update complete
- Increased Focus on Vacant Property Ordinance Enforcement
- Staffing shortages may impact response times

Housing Division Updates – Affordable Housing Development

- Updated the City's Affordable Housing Ordinance
 - Increased requirements from 10% moderate to 12% low and moderate (50/50 split)
 - Increased in-lieu fees by 8.4%
 - Added lower density ownership housing type
- Since 2018, City has approved entitlements for over 1,000 new affordable units (931 rental/83 ownership)
- City has subsidized 5 of 8 affordable developments providing over \$26M in funding
- SoMi and La Playa projects will be marketing new units shortly

Planning Application Summary

- Application activity has slowed in Planning
- Focus has been on long-range projects such as Density Bonus Ordinance Updates (adopted), Housing Element (adopted and certified by HCD), Residential Design Standards (December), Sidewalk Vendor Ordinance (adopted) Tree Preservation Ordinance
- Increase in applications for ADUs, Junior ADU's, SB9 applications

THE PROGRAM IS A MASSIVE SUCCESS!


The most recent promotion launch began Monday November 20, with **\$125,000** available for bonus cards.


All of the money was gone in less than **48 hours**!

Since the inception of the program, **\$950,000** in gift cards have entered the Hayward business economy.

The City infused \$450,000 in ARPA dollars, while customers added **\$500,000** of their own dollars to purchase gift cards.

THOUGHTS FROM BUSINESSES

•Survey sent to participating businesses for feedback

•55% of participating businesses indicated program boosted their sales 5 - 25%

•80% indicated the program brought new customers each month

•Some Comments Shared by Businesses

- "This was my first year in business, but I saw a very large increase in revenue when the \$100 bonus gift card was offered. Over 100% increase."
- "Customers loved the program and came from all over to spend money in Hayward that they would not have spent otherwise. They were impressed with the support the city was offering to it's small businesses and many of them were hoping that the program would come back this year."





THOUGHTS FROM THE CUSTOMERS

•75% of purchasers tried a new business

•60% of purchasers were very likely to return to those new businesses

•Some comments shared by customers:

•"I think this is an amazing thing the city of Hayward is doing. I love supporting local restaurants and trying new food and it's a great way to do that."

•"I felt everything was very professionally done and it really helped my family in need to be able to get out and enjoy a breakfast or lunch or dinner. I would definitely buy them again if you ever do this program again. I would like to buy some more."
