The Council Economic Development Committee is accepting public comments prior to the meeting via email or during the meeting via the Zoom link or Zoom dial-in information listed on the published agenda.

If you are making your comments during the meeting please note:

- Click the "Raise Hand" button to request to speak when the Staff Liaison calls for public comments
 on an eligible agenda item. You will be permitted to speak during your turn and muted after the
 allotted time (3 minutes).
- When joining by phone, click *9 to raise a hand to speak. Press *6 to unmute. We kindly request speakers to mute or turn down the meeting video when it is their opportunity to speak as it may cause interference with the speaker system.
- Use headphones/mic for better sound quality and less background noise
- Decorum: Please be mindful that virtual meetings are public and will be recorded. All meeting rules of procedure and decorum, including speaker time limits, will apply. Brief History

- Downtown Hayward Community
 Benefit District (CBD) established
 September 2018; formed for 10-year
 term, ends in 2028.
- ➤ <u>Sept. 2018 Jun. 2019</u>: Corporation Formed, Bylaws Adopted, Bank Selected, Insurance Acquired, Office Leased, Equipment Purchased.
- ➤ <u>July 2019</u>: In-House Maintenance Ops. Commenced. Provided Essential Services During Covid Era.
- ➤ <u>May 2022</u>: Transitioned to Third-Party Maintenance Vendor. Switched Vendors in August 2023.
- ➤ March 2025: Brought Maintenance Ops. Back In-House; Expanding Service Model & Downtown Activations.

Overview

- > 12 Member Board of Directors; Meets Bi-Monthly at Lincoln Landing
- > FY25 Annual Budget: \$870,756 (Assessment Income + Carry Forward)
- > 239 Parcels/150+ Property Owners (Includes CoH & BART)
- ➤ Provides services to downtown property owners <u>above and beyond</u> what the City of Hayward provides; the DHIA does not clean inside municipal/private parking lots.
- ➤ Majority of district business is conducted through three Advisory Committees.

The DHIA's Three Advisory Committees

- ➤ <u>Sidewalk Operations</u>, <u>Beautification & Order (SOBO) Committee</u>:
 - Oversees the District's Clean & Safe Operations and Enhanced Landscaping Program
- ➤ <u>District Identity & Streetscape Improvement (DISI) Committee</u>:
 - Oversees the District's Marketing and Media Promotions, as well as its local
 Placemaking Projects and Special Events Support
- ➤ <u>Land Use & Project Review Committee</u>:
 - Reviews the District's Land Use and Mobility Issues, in addition to Reviewing New Development Projects and Capital Improvement Projects in Downtown Hayward.


Sidewalk Operations, Beautification & Order (SOBO) Highlights

- ➤ Provides seven days-a-week maintenance coverage of the downtown area. Recently transitioned back to in-house from 3rd party vendor.
- Provided regular steam cleaning services districtwide year-round.
- ➤ Installed 20+ hanging flower baskets on B Street.
- ➤ Purchased and deployed 20 decorative planters throughout the Downtown Hayward.
- Oversaw the installation of string lights along major downtown corridors, including Main Street, B Street, Foothill Blvd.

District Identity & Streetscape Improvement (DISI) Highlights

- ➤ Since March 2022, the DHIA has contracted with Olive Public Relations to promote the downtown with dedicated PR & Social Media efforts.
- ➤ DHIA Facebook & Instagram have grown to 6.1k & 4.5k respectively in followers, allowing the DHIA to leverage these channels to support local businesses and initiatives.
- ➤ Supported local events to bring families back to downtown: May Day, Latin Jazz Festival, Chamber Street Parties, Juneteenth Celebration, Mariachi Festival.
- ➤ Designed new "Downtown Mural" banners for installation throughout the district, 117 banners in all.
- ➤ Each holiday season, the DHIA decorates the downtown district. In 2024, this included adorning wreaths, garland, and decorative lights on gateways.



Discover Downtown Hayward

Known for its historic roots, the City of Hayward is the third largest city in Alameda County and referred to locally as the "Heart of the Bay". Spanning over 24 blocks, Downtown Hayward is emerging as a destination for culture & community in the East Bay.

District Challenges

- ➤ Long-Term Property Vacancies or Under-Capitalized Businesses.
- ➤ Undeveloped/Underutilized Parcels in District, No Commercial Capture.
- ➤ The Downtown "Loop" & High-Speed Traffic Around the Core.
- ➤ A Surplus of Free Parking: An Unleveraged Public Asset Downtown:
 - Downtown Has 10+ City-Owned Parking Lots/Garages
- ➤ Code Enforcement on Illegal Vending, Non-Permitted Events, etc.
- ➤ Acute Property Crime:
 - Broken Storefront Windows
 - Vehicle Break-Ins in Muni Lots
 - Downtown Public Safety


