In July 2022, 55% of young people were employed in the US, which is 21 million individuals who work low-wage jobs. Ten states are working to weaken child labor laws, which will infringe on the right of minors in the workforce.

Many associations in California have already been in support of the legislation to help counter the weakening of child labor laws. This bill will prohibit employers from exploiting workers who are minors. Ms. Karishma hopes to gain the support of the HYC on this bill. This bill will protect minors from sexual harassment and other hazardous conditions.

#### 7:06 HAYWARD CITY COUNCIL, HARD, HUSD & LIBRARY REPORTS

Hayward City Council: Mayor Salinas acknowledges Ms. Karishma to come to speak with the committee. Acknowledges that some commissioners are graduating and going to colleges and encourages commissioners to keep in touch. To those coming back next year, Mayor Salinas wants and hopes these commissioners will stay engaged. In the city of Hayward, there are 150,000 people who live in the city, and about 40% of the population is younger than 21 years old. This is 64,000 people. The HYC members represent 40% of the population of Hayward. For those who are coming back, their voices are incredibly important.

There is a new council member, Ray Bonilla. He is born and raised in Hayward. He is a great individual and knows Hayward incredibly well. He is familiar with every neighborhood. His career in public service started in the HYC. Councilmember Goldstein is a new addition as well. The council is finally full. On 5/9/2023 will have a meeting delegating what are the goals of the council and the city. There are six priorities of the council. Keep Hayward Clean, Housing, Safety, Quality of Life, Budget, and Stewardship. Will review the priorities and see what will be renewed or altered.

The total city portfolio is about \$401 million dollars. This money is carved into two different areas: money that is spent every year and the other portion that is invested. The city spends about \$200 million annually.

HARD: Opportunities for volunteers in parks. These are available on May 20th in Greenwood Park and in June. The next cycle of Clean and Green provides individuals with the opportunity so they can cut hedges, clear trash, etc. Starting the budget season, so if HYC has ideas about where the tax dollars should go, can contact HARD. Recreation summertime is the busiest season, and there are volunteer opportunities for community engagement. If commissioners want to get job experience, these opportunities are plentiful at HARD.

HUSD: Dr. Raymond, who is currently at Castro Valley, will assume the role of Assistant Superintendent at HUSD.
