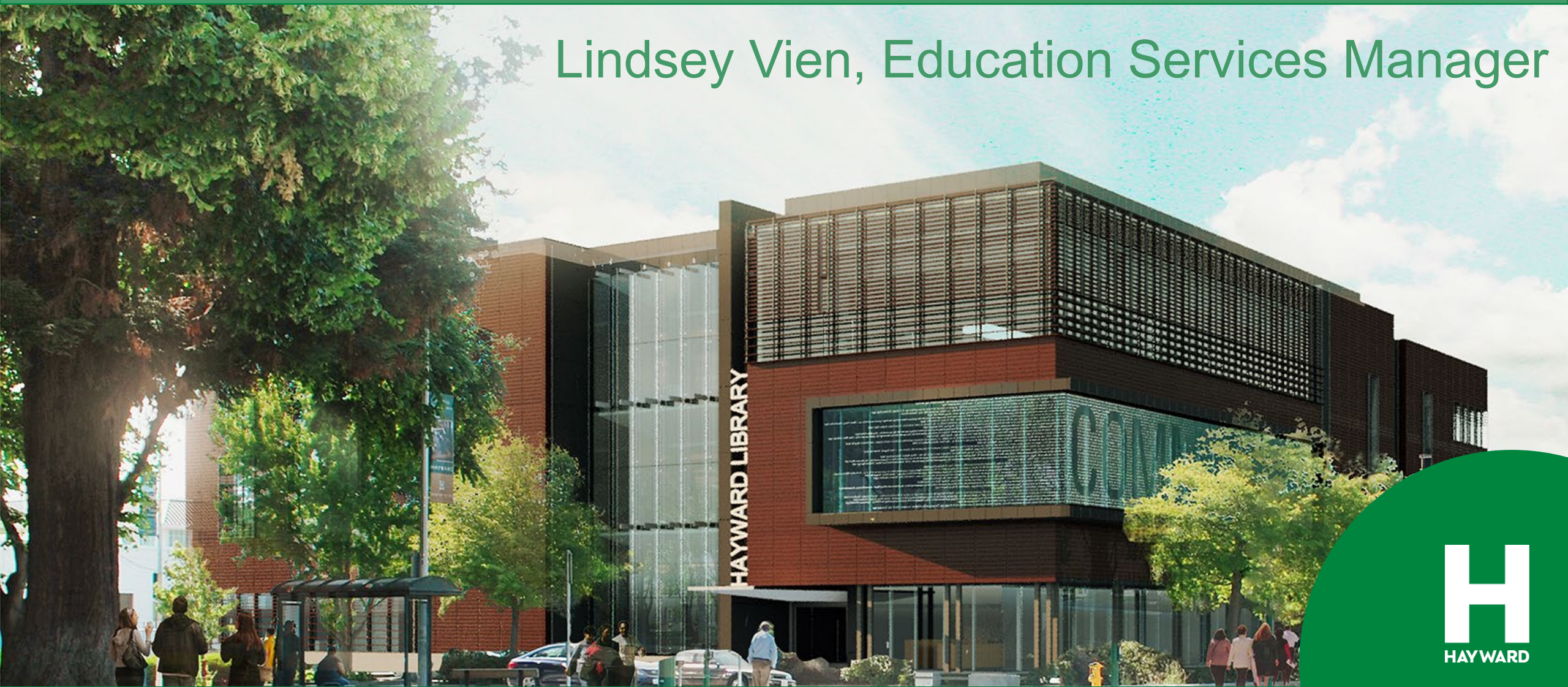

After-School Homework Support

Through a unique partnership between the City of Hayward and HUSD, after-school drop-in Homework Support is offered at 3 school site locations and 2 Library locations, each day after-school for 2 hours.

Our Goal

To provide students with a safe and welcoming learning environment and to assist students in K-12th grades with all of their academic needs.

Our Impact

- 269 sessions offered
- 3,816 student attendances
- 63 volunteer tutors, from local colleges donated 3,152.25 hours of support to youth, improving their core academics
- 688 live 1:1 Tutor.com sessions offered





Closing the Digital Divide

Homework Support Centers provide students and parents access to Chromebooks, hotspots, and tablets each day after-school.

Students have access to:

- Internet
- Free printing
- IXL
- Typing programs
- Reading and spelling programs
- Online tutoring via Tutor.com

Our Impact

- 1,737 computer logins during HSC hours
- 684 HUSD students issued Tech Devices

In partnership with HUSD, the Library has processed:

- 7,871 new library cards for middle schools and high schools! That's every student!

Words for Lunch

Children birth to 18 years old receive a:

- Free, nutritionally-balanced lunch
- 1-hour reading experience with trained read-aloud volunteer
- FREE book to build in-home library



Summer Learning Camps

3-day camps that focus on Common Core subjects

Lesson plans cover math, science, reading, writing, history and computer skills

Interactive lesson plans and activities

Program Assistants introduce topics using interactive presentations and reinforce learning through hands-on activities, group projects, and interactive games

Virtual Jr. Summer Learning and Drop-In Camps

On-demand lesson plans and craft videos are available online and families can pick-up craft kits that include activity materials



Summer Program Impact

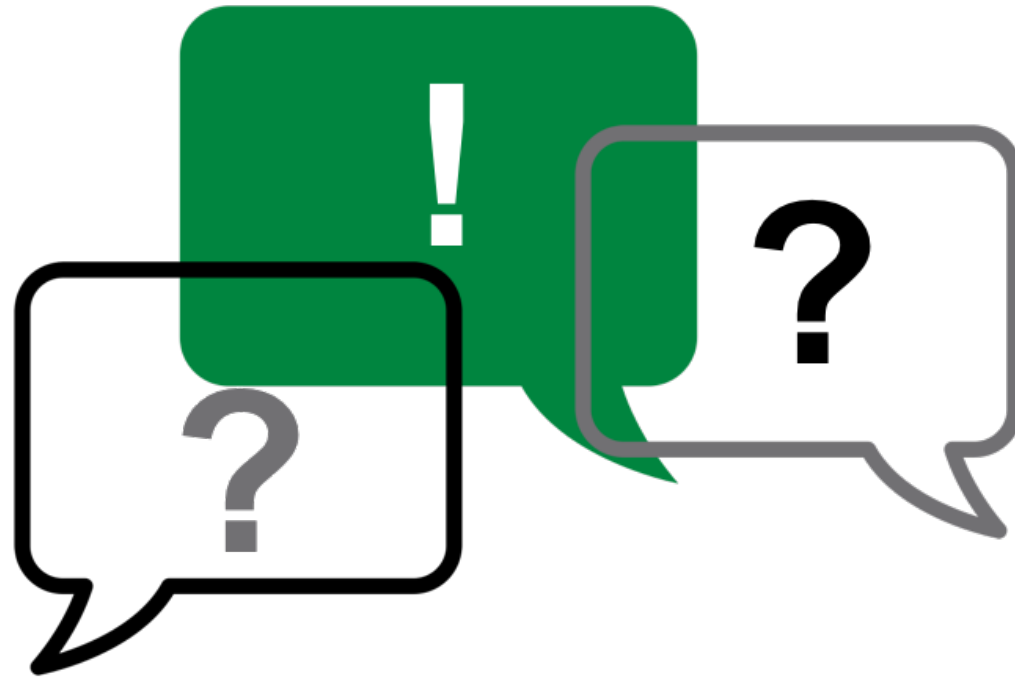
By the Numbers:

July 2022

- 4,808 FREE books distributed to build in-home libraries
- 2,066 FREE meals distributed over Summer
- 36 volunteer tutors donated 475.5 hours
- 1,964 children served
 - 1,275 Words for Lunch attendances
 - 169 Summer Learning Camp students
 - 100 Jr. Summer Camp children
 - 420 Drop-in Summer Learning Camp children

What Do We Do?

Youth Services serves children and teens and their parents, caregivers, and teachers. We offer programs, collections, and activities to help nurture a love of reading and learning in dedicated spaces designed for children and parents to read, play, and learn.



Early Childhood

Storytime - Storytime programs introduce young children to books, rhymes, music, and peer interaction while building a foundation of pre-literacy skills and a life-long love of books and reading. Available in English, Spanish, and Chinese.

1,000 Books Before Kindergarten – Encourages families to read with their children nightly before bed. Families receive prizes of free books for every 100 books read.

Take-Home Storytime Kits – In partnership with First Five Alameda County, distributed 168 kits to families that participate in library storytimes, Kits are available in English, Spanish, and Chinese, and include books and props often used in storytimes such as scarves, shaky eggs, and felt board characters.

School Age/Family

- Special Events/Performers
- Weekly take-home crafts
- Reading Buddies – teen volunteers are matched with a child in elementary school for children to practice their reading skills.
- Class visits at the library or in the classroom.
- Library card drives (in conjunction with Ed Services)
- SORA Reading App – allows HUSD students to check out library eBooks using their HUSD student ID without a HPL library card.

- Maintain print and online book, movie, and media collections in multiple languages.

- Online resources for homework and recreational reading.
 - LOTE 4 Kids - digital books in 50+ languages, together with English translations. New books and languages released each month.

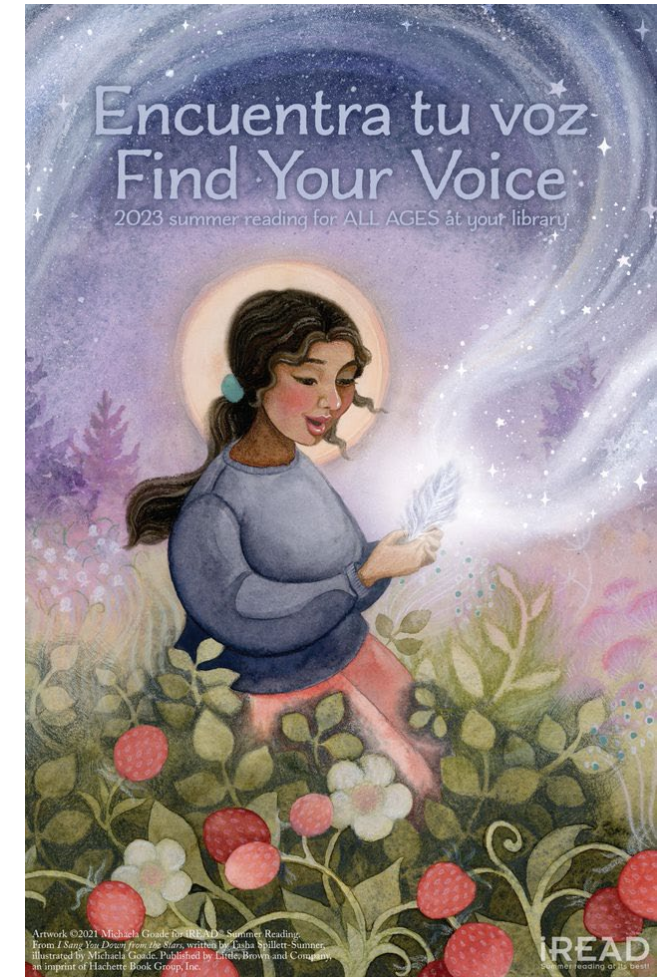




Summer Reading Challenge

June 12 – August 5, 2023

- Fun way to encourage kids to keep reading over the summer.
- Available for all ages – children, teens, and adults register for SRC in the library or using the Beanstack app.
- Children and teens track each day they read. For every 7 days they read, they will receive 3 free books. If they read every day during the program, they'll receive 25 books to build their home libraries.

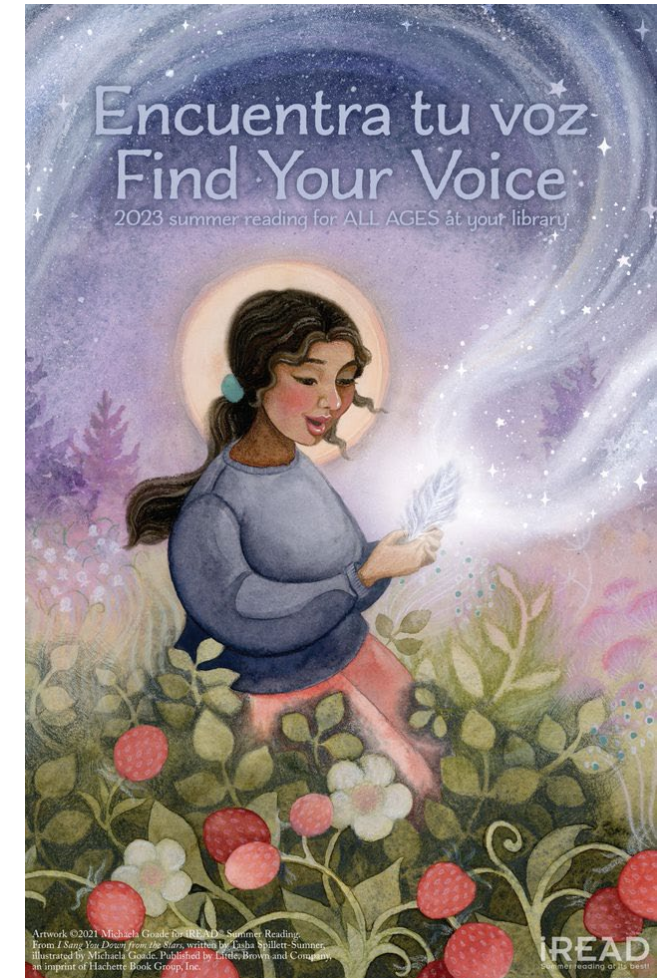




Summer Reading Challenge

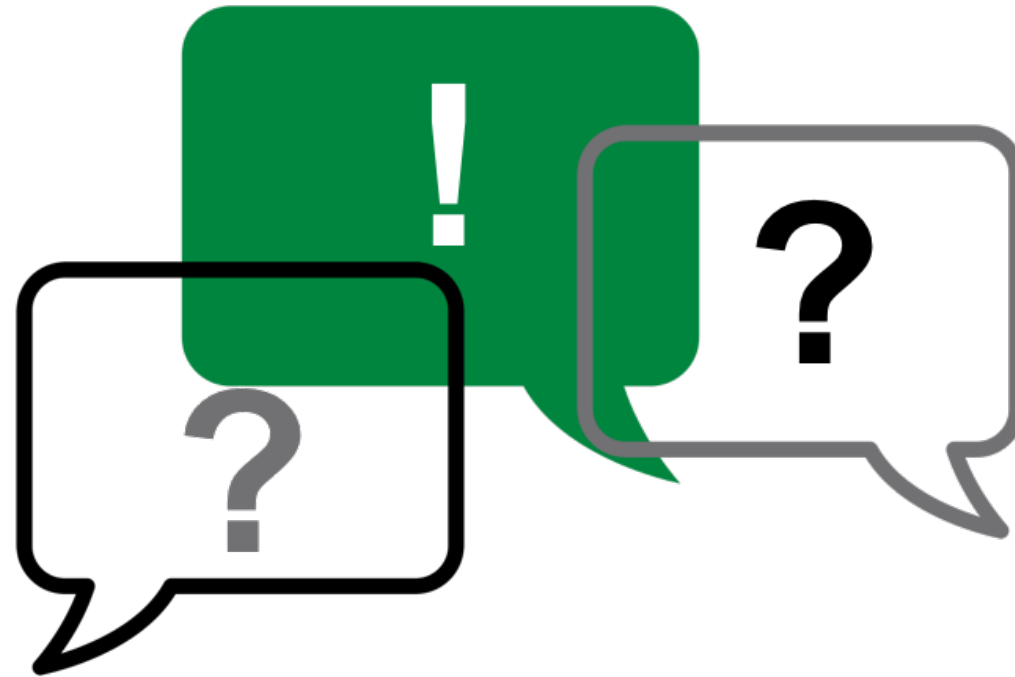
