 allotted time (3 minutes).
- When joining by phone, click *9 to raise a hand to speak. Press *6 to unmute. We kindly request speakers to mute or turn down the meeting video when it is their opportunity to speak as it may cause interference with the speaker system.
- Use headphones/mic for better sound quality and less background noise

Financing - Start-Up and Early Stage Entrepreneurs

- Most difficult stage for financing
- Lack of business history
- Banks require 1-2 years in business
- Projection based financing, need a Business Plan
- Possible sources
 - Several CDFIs fund this stage
 - SBA Financing
- Funding range: 50K, 100K, 350K













SBA Financing - Start-Up/Established Business

SBA 7a – up to \$5M

- General purpose loan. It can be used for:
 - > Starting up a new business
 - Purchasing a business
 - > Business expansion
 - Capital expenditure
 - > Real estate purchase
 - Permanent working capital
 - Refinancing existing business loans
 - > Any other legitimate business use

SBA 504 - up to \$5M

for long-term asset purchase



Bank Financing - Established Business

SBA Loans & Conventional Bank Loans & Credit Lines

- SBA Loans
- Conventional Bank Loans
 - Less restrictive use
 - Larger loan amount
 - Less paper work
 - Market interest rates
 - Established business with profitable history



PHASE I


- Feasibility Study
- Up to \$300,000 and 6-12 months (SBIR)or 12-month (STTR) Award

PHASE II

- Expand on Phase I R&D
- Up to \$2,000,000 and 2-year Award

PHASE III

- Commercialization Stage
- Use of non-SBIR/STTR Funds





- ✓ Maximum height in IP zoning district: 75'
 - ✓ Proposed:
 100' (108'
 to penthouse)
- ✓ Approving body may allow building height to exceed maximum if the project will result in public benefits/ amenities that couldn't be achieved otherwise






STACK INFRASTRUCTURE GLOBAL FOOTPRINT


