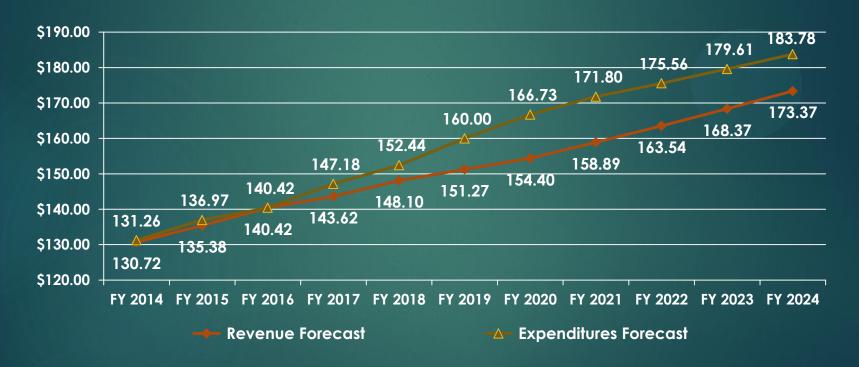
### General Fund Forecast: The Gap

## General Fund Gap Persists



- Some revenue categories improving projections may be adjusted – possibly reducing future deficit projections
- Expenditure increases driving deficit
- Need to consider revenues & expenditures
- General Fund 10-Year Plan Update in February/March 2016

#### Ten Year Plan Cost Drivers



- Escalating CalPERS rates by 2020 rates at 30% 55% of payroll
- Retiree Medical minimum contribution (ARC) = 4.1 M shortfall
- \$1M cost in FY 2018 due to Affordable Care Act "Cadillac tax" impacts to be discussed with bargaining units in future negotiations
- Funding for critical resources to meet increasing demands
- Mid-year update will reflect labor agreement net costs

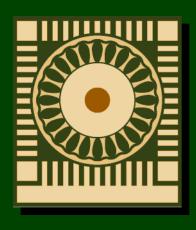

- Solar panels and electric vehicle charging systems

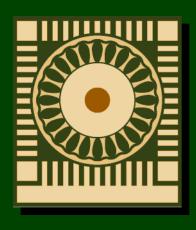


#### Staff recommends that the City Council:

# Authorization to Implement Near-Term Strategies to Assist Homeless Individuals in Hayward

#### SUMMARY



- ▶ Sept. 22, 2015, Council work session: First of a series on the issues of homelessness and disruptive street behaviors
- Per Council direction, additional policy sessions over the next 12 months will be focused on near-term, mediumterm, and long-term strategies in turn
- ► This report is focused on near-term strategies and recommends three for immediate implementation.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS



#### NEAR-TERM STRATEGIES TO ASSIST HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS

- 1. Provide up to \$25,000 in match funding to help open a new winter warming center for people in north Hayward
- Coordinate with County of Alameda and Abode Services to expand homeless outreach to outdoor encampments
- Implement a one-year pilot program, Downtown Streets Team, to provide employment and job training to homeless individuals.

#### Winter Warming Center



- Proposed new warming center in the north Hayward area would be in addition to the existing center in south Hayward
- Basic overnight shelter, warmth, security and hot food during inclement winter weather for up to 30 individuals
- Partnership with County of Alameda and experienced homeless service provider BOSS
- County of Alameda has committed \$25,000 toward the costs. Total project cost is up to \$50,000 for up to 50 nights.
- Recommend that Council authorize up to \$25,000 in match funding from the General Fund.

#### Outreach to Encampments



- Expand outreach services to homeless encampments in Hayward and unincorporated areas
- Build trust with homeless individuals, establish service plans, connect each individual with services and assistance available to them, help homeless individuals move toward permanent housing
- Partnership with experienced service provider Abode Services to provide the actual boots-on-the-ground outreach in Hayward area encampments
- County of Alameda has committed \$180,000 toward project there is no cost to the City of Hayward for the project
- Recommend that Council adopt a resolution acknowledging and memorializing the expanded outreach partnership.

## Employment & Job Skills Pilot Program



- Proposed one year pilot program, Downtown Streets Team, to provide work experience and job skills training to homeless individuals in Hayward
- ▶ Pilot program one-year goals:
  - Provide work experience and training to 45 homeless individuals
  - ▶ Place 12 homeless individuals in permanent employment
  - Secure permanent housing for 8 homeless individuals
- Pilot program cost: \$205,000. Qualifies as economic development under CDBG rules. Funding is available in the restricted CDBG Economic Development program income fund
- Recommend that Council authorize \$205,000 from restricted CDBG economic development program income fund to implement one-year pilot program.

#### **NEXT STEPS**



- This report is focused on near-term strategies and recommends three for immediate implementation
- Should Council approve the recommended near-term strategies, staff will take all necessary steps to immediately implement them
- A policy session to discuss additional medium-term strategies is in development and is scheduled to come before Council in February, 2016
- Additional long-term strategies are in development and will be brought to Council for additional review and direction in May, 2016.
