San Jose	30,046	6%	0.32	16	160
Mountain View	13,447	3%	0.33	7	70
Palo Alto	5,231	1%	0.18	5	50
Redwood City	2,279	0%	0.06	7	70
Total	512,766	100%	1.27	70	700

Bike Sharing



- CSU East Bay (Zagster)
 - Launched October 2014
 - > 10 bikes
 - > first 3 hours for free
 - > ridership averaged 0.4 trips per bike per day
- San Mateo (SoBi)
 - Just approved by city council
 - ▶ 50 bikes
 - No stations
 - Launch in 2016





Bicycle Sharing



- Challenges for Hayward
 - Lack of infrastructure
 - Downtown Loop
 - low number of bicycle commuters
 - > 0.7% in Hayward
 - > 3.5% in Redwood City



Cost of Bike Sharing



Bay Area Bike Share \$930 per bike per year

CSU East Bay \$1,320 per bike per year

San Mateo \$1,800 per bike per year

East Bay Community Energy



- Alameda County Steering Committee
 - Monthly meetings started in June
 - RFP for Technical Study released in August
 - > 3 Proposals



East Bay Community Energy



- December 8 Board of Supervisors
 - Staff recommendation was to Contract with MRW & Associates



Peninsula Clean Energy



- San Mateo Co. Expects Launch in October 2016
 - Three energy scenarios evaluated:
 - 1. 35% renewable, up to 50% by 2030
 - 2. 50% renewable, up to 75% by 2030
 - 3. 100% renewable energy
- Study found Scenario 2 would result in lower rates and fewer GHGs than PG&E



PCIA or Exit Fees



- Power Charge Indifference Adjustment (PCIA) fee
- Fee charged to CCA customers
- Marin Clean Energy
 - Currently pay is \$6.70 per month
 - In 2016, fee increases to \$13.00 per month
