SPECIFIC PLAN GOALS

Goal & Policy Structure

GOAL

A goal is an objective that sets **general direction**; it is a future goal or end. It is an expression of community values. Goals are not expressed as actions, but rather as ends that are already achieved.

POLICY

A policy is a specific statement that guides decision making. A policy is based on, and helps implement, the goals of the Specific Plan.

PROGRAM

This is an action, requirement, procedure, program, or technique that implements out specific plan policy.







SPECIFIC PLAN GOALS

Land Use, Community Design, & Housing Goals

Goal 1: Downtown is transformed into a vibrant, walkable City center that serves as a regional destination to play, work, and live for City residents, neighboring communities, and local college students.

Goal 2: Downtown is a beautiful, safe, and high-quality pedestrian-oriented environment for all ages to enjoy day or night, with sufficient and attractive lighting, sidewalk amenities, landscaping, and inviting ground floor frontages.

Goal 3: A wide variety of housing types are available to meet the economic and physical needs of a diverse population.

SPECIFIC PLAN GOALS

Mobility Goals

Goal 4: The public right-of-way is recognized as the backbone of the public realm and Downtown streets are comfortable for people walking and bicycling, efficient and convenient for people taking transit, and accommodating to people driving automobiles at a posted speed limits.

Goal 5: Public transportation, walking, biking and shared rides are the preferred means of travel for most trips in Downtown thereby reducing cutthrough traffic and the need for parking while also supporting economic development and sustainability initiatives.
