1-on-1 Tutoring


Tutoring for adults reading and writing below the 8th grade level:

- Flexible scheduling options


Adult learners are matched with trained literacy volunteers

1-on-1 Tutoring: For Learners


- Learner assessments

Opportunities to receive a fully-funded scholarship to earn an accredited high school diploma, career certificate, and career portfolio






English Conversation Circles

Volunteer tutors oversee the Computer Lab sessions and provide instruction on relevant lessons


