SB1383 Hayward Background

- July 8, 2019:** Sustainability Committee received report on SB1383.
- May 10, 2021:** Sustainability Committee received report on SB1383 and overview of countywide model Organics Reduction and Recycling Ordinance (ORRO).
- September 13, 2021:** Sustainability Committee received report providing update on Countywide ORRO and Opt-In Ordinance.
- Sustainability Committee Recommended Council Adopt the Opt-In Ordinance.**

SB1383 Background



Goal: Reduce Organics to Landfill (based on 2014 numbers)

- 75% Reduction in Organics to landfill by 2025
- 20% Edible Food Recovered by 2025

January 1, 2022:

- Jurisdictions required to adopt ordinance to enforce the law

SB1383 Requirements

- All Businesses and Residents Sort Organics
- Edible Food Recovery
- Reporting
- Education and Outreach
- Jurisdictions Procure Organic Products (Compost /Mulch)
- Standardized Cart Colors
- Enforcement
- Monitoring for Contamination



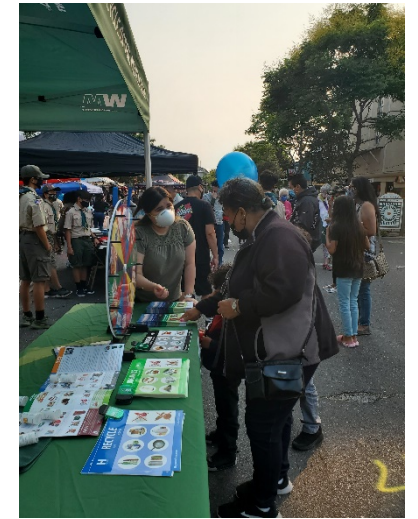
SB1383 Requirements

- All Businesses and Residents Sort Organics
 - Most Hayward Businesses and Residents Already Sorting Organics
 - Waivers
- Edible Food Recovery
 - Tier 1 and Tier 2 generators
 - StopWaste Coordinating with ACCFB
 - Enforcement
 - Alameda County Department of Environmental Health



SB1383 Requirements

- Reporting
- Education/Outreach
- Procuring Compost/Mulch
 - 13,000 tons compost or mulch
 - \$650,000 - \$1 Million
 - Working with StopWaste



SB1383 Requirements

- Cart Colors
 - Recycling = Blue
 - Trash = Black or Gray
 - Organics = Green
- Enforcement
- Monitoring Contamination
 - Smart Truck Cameras
 - Surcharges Start 2022
 - ORRO Enforcement Start 2024



Countywide SB 1383 Ordinance

Organics Reduction and Recycling Ordinance (ORRO)

- **Replaces the Mandatory Recycling Ordinance (MRO)**
 - Reflects the MRO
 - Inspections for Contamination
 - Fines for Non-Compliance
 - Waivers
- **Enforcement Flexibility**
 - Specific Roles Determined Later
 - Compliance Phased In

Countywide SB 1383 Ordinance

Organics Reduction and Recycling Ordinance (ORRO)

- **Opt-In Ordinance Needed**

If Hayward decides **not** to Opt-In to ORRO:

Hayward will need to draft, enact, and enforce its own ordinance to comply with CalRecycle regulations.

Deadline for jurisdictions to adopt Opt-in Ordinance to meet CalRecycle deadline of January 1,2022	December 2, 2021

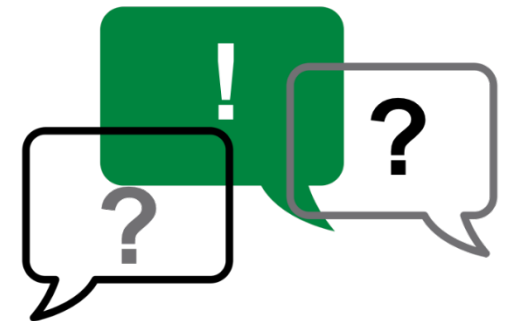
Next Steps
