

Site Details

- Nearly 0.18 acres
- Formerly occupied by two-story commercial building
- Destroyed by fire in 2020; building foundation still in ground
- Zoning: Downtown-Main Street
- General Plan Land Use
 Designation: Central City Retail and Office Commercial

Project Details

- 6-story mixed-use building
- 1,200 square feet ground floor commercial space
- Residential lobby, office, bike storage room and other ancillary spaces on ground floor
- 30 residential apartments on upper 5 floors
- 29-space underground parking garage w/ stacker system
- 3 units affordable to very low income households, 27 market-rate units



Entitlements Required

- 1. <u>Major Site Plan Review*</u> for all new projects in Downtown Specific Plan Area creating 5,000 square feet or more of impervious surface (project will create 7,668 square feet)
- 2. <u>Density Bonus*</u> of 50% over base number of allowable units (base number of allowable units is 20, applicant is proposing 30 total units) by providing 15% of base number as affordable to very low income households

*Both entitlements require Planning Commission approval



Density Bonus Incentives/Concessions & Waivers

✓ Density Bonus projects proposing 15% of units affordable to very low income households are entitled to up to 3 incentives/concessions that result in real, identifiable project cost savings

✓ All Density Bonus projects are entitled to unlimited number of waivers or reductions of development standards that would physically prevent project from being built at the allowable density





BUSINESS SELECTION

•Under each program staff is targeting to assist 8 - 10 businesses.

•Application period was open for 1 month with 65 business requesting applications. 33 applications we received

 Look at those that will have the greatest impact on the corridor

•Geographically dispersed throughout the city

ON-CALL ARCHITECTS

Selection

Staff will identify the business and the approximate grant dollar amount for the sought-after improvements Economic Development will release a notice of project to the bench firms, review bid proposals and select the firm to manage the project

Design

Selected firm will meet with the business owner to identify needs of the business and create a design plan for improvements to mee the objectives of the program. Design firm will work with Staff to review proposed plan to ensure it meets City program goals and objectives

Permit & Build

Design Firm will submit and obtain any required permits from the City and assist business owner with selecting construction professionals and act as project manager during the construction phase and assist with resolving any issues as they arise.







•Review applications received and rank the applications based on requested improvements, impact on their commercial corridor, matching dollars for the proposed project and geographical disbursement

 Match up interested businesses with an architect to begin the design process
