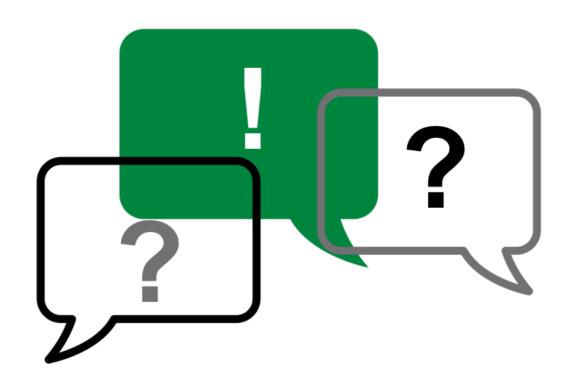

Firearms Regulations Background

- City currently has 2 establishments, both ancillary sales
 - Big 5 Sporting Goods
 - Security Six
- Firearms sales regulated under the HMC
 - Firearms Dealers Permit required (PD)
 - Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for Primary use (DSD)
 - No CUP if ancillary (less than 10% of floor area dedicated to sales)



Videotaping Gun Sales

Giffords Law Center

- Lack of regulations at federal or state level
- Provides valuable evidence to law enforcement

Current Regulations/Process

Could be added as part of any CUP or Firearms
Dealers Permit

Staff Recommendation

Amend Chapter 6, Article 11 to explicitly include a provision under subsection 6-11.05, Conditions of Approval

Establishing Location Criteria for Firearms Sales

Giffords Law Center

 Prohibit sales near sensitive locations including schools, churches, playgrounds to reduce children's exposure

Current Regulations/Process

 Evaluated on a case-by-case basis as it is <u>not</u> a listed use in Zoning Ordinance

Staff Recommendation

 Amend Chapter 6, Article 11 to explicitly include a provision under subsection 6-11.03, Application Form; and prohibit within ½ mile of any school or playground

Prohibiting Possession of Firearms on Public Property

Giffords Law Center

 Helps keep guns out of spaces where freedom of expression and assembly is important, where children frequent, and where disagreements are common

Current Regulations/Process

 Have regulations related to prohibiting discharge of weapons in the City limits, but no language prohibiting possession on City property. HARD does have provisions prohibiting possession in their parks.

Staff Recommendation

 Amend Chapter 3, Public Safety to specifically regulate the possession of firearms on City Property

Safe Storage in the Home

Giffords Law Center

 Local Child Access Prevention (CAP) laws to enhance existing regulations related to safe storage of guns in homes to help prevent accidental shootings, suicides and firearms theft

Current Regulations

- CAP laws already exist under State law
- CA Penal Code Section 25100 punishes the criminal storage of a firearm; can be a felony or misdemeanor

Staff Recommendation

- Do not adopt any local provision, but rely on existing state laws given any local law that is substantively different or stricter than state law would raise validity issues under the Second Amendment
- Difficult to enforce

Gun Buy-Back Programs

Council also requested information about Gun Buy-Back Programs.

Current and Past Practice

- Historically held a gun buy-back event at the Business Costco
 - Guns relinquished were inconsistent with those found in the field, many didn't function properly, and all were legally owned
- PD will accept guns for destruction at any time at the HPD

Staff Recommendation

Given concerns over program effectiveness, cost concerns, and insufficient staff capacity, staff does <u>not</u> recommend creating a formal buyback program
