VIII. Community Cleanups and Upcoming Events

a. Tennyson Road (Panjon & Huntwood) 11/23/19 – Task Force Member Bowers & Young

Discussion: There was a good turnout for the event. It was a bit difficult to set up the table and canopy on the damp grass. We may want to think about setting up on a cement area. We were in a visible area.

We collected 172 items, 79 of those items were bags, and 67 grabbers checked out.

b. Mt. Eden Park 01/25/20 - Chair Divine, Vice Chairs Haman and Manzo

Chair Ali Divine: We will be at Mt. Eden Park for our event on Saturday. We will set up the KHCG tent in the grass area near the Mt. Eden park sign next to baseball fields. The canopy, food table, and chairs will be setup by the basketball courts. We have 43 pre-registered volunteers. We have a QR code that volunteers can scan and register the day of the event on Eventbrite.

Director Rullman: the beautification portion of this event will be in the median. City staff will be on site and they will close the inside lane in both directions so volunteers will have a safe work zone. Please encourage the volunteers to use the crosswalk when accessing the median. We will need about 25-30 volunteers working on the planting portion of the project.

City staff stripped the median and replanted the trees. There will be planting of small plants in the median on Saturday. After the event, City staff will pull the drip line and place the bark mulch.

Chair Ali Divine: The event is catered by Erik's Deli and we ordered a variety of sandwiches with side salad.

Discussion: Someone will pick up the food from Erik's Deli at 10:45 AM and the food will be available for the volunteers at 11:00 AM. City staff will set up additional tables and chairs for the volunteers. We will give the volunteers a wristband so we can identify them when they go through the food line.

c. St. Joachim Catholic Church 03/28/20 - Chair Divine, Vice Chairs Haman and Manzo

Chair Ali Divine: the next event is March 28th at St. Joachim Catholic Church. We will have a meeting February and we can discuss this event at the next meeting.

a. Council Member Updates

Council Member Márquez: The City Council had a Work Session last Tuesday looking at the barriers for developing Affordable Housing and fast-tracking housing projects that are affordable for people to move into home ownership. If you are interested in anything housing related like housing density, zoning, affordable housing, please look at the Council Agenda packets.

On February 4, 2020 we will adopt our Strategic Road Map which is our plan for the next three years and the projects every department will be responsible for working on. If you are interested in the Strategic Road Map please look at the Work Session packet from January 14, 2020.

On March 13, 2020 for International Women's Day we will host a free event at City Hall in the Rotunda from 5:00 PM – 8:00 PM. This is a partnership between City of Hayward, League of Women Voters, Hayward Unified School District, and many other organizations.
