## **General Outline: Nominating Ad-Hoc Committee**

Selection of Nominating Ad-Hoc Committee members shall be conducted as the first order of business on that month's agenda. The nominating committee is selected by the Chair (presiding officer) and accepted by a vote of the membership. Persons serving on the ad hoc committee can be nominated for office.

The Nominating Ad-Hoc Committee's role is to convene a meeting, review nominee requests, and make a recommendation of willing and qualified candidates for the Keep Hayward Clean and Green Task Force Chair and Vice Chair positions. It is recommended that the Nominating Ad-Hoc Committee consist of no less than three (3) and no more than five (5) members.

## **Selection Process: Nominating Ad-Hoc Committee**

- 1. At a meeting prior to the Election, the Nominating Ad-Hoc Committee Selection will be added to the agenda.
- 2. The presiding officer will commence the selection process for ad-hoc committee members from the TF membership, who meet the recommended criteria outlined below. Staff will provide the presiding officer with a copy of the membership roster, bylaws, and attendance records prior to the meeting.
  - Member must be in good standing
  - Member must meet minimum attendance requirements
  - Member participates on at least one subcommittee
  - Member with at least one year of service on the task force
- 3. At the conclusion of the selection process, the presiding officer will declare the selection process closed and proceed with the voting process to accept the Nominating Ad-Hoc Committee.
