SUBJECT: Adoption of Ordinance Adopting the Downtown Development Code and

Amending the City's Zoning Map to Incorporate All Proposed Downtown Hayward Regulating Plan Map Amendments Contained in Figure 2.1.020.1 of

the Downtown Specific Plan and Code

RECOMMENDATION

That the Council adopts the Ordinance introduced on April 30, 2019.

SUMMARY

This item entails adoption of an Ordinance adopting the Downtown Development Code and amending the City's Zoning Map to incorporate all proposed Downtown Hayward Regulating Plan Map amendments, introduced on April 30, 2019, by Council Member Zermeño.

BACKGROUND

The Ordinance was introduced by Council Member Zermeño at the April 30, 2019, special meeting of the City Council with the following vote:

The motion included two additional recommendations: 1) Convert A Street to a two-way street as part of the short-term improvements for street modifications; and 2) strongly encourage the production of on-site affordable housing in the Plan Area consistent with the City's Inclusionary Housing Ordinance.

The following sections of the Hayward Downtown Specific Plan and Code will be updated to reflect the additional recommendations as indicated in Attachment IV.

- 1) Section 3.2.1 Street Modifications: Short-term (5 years)
- 2) Goal 3: Housing Policy H2 Affordable Housing
