1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, Introductions- Called to Order at 4:35 p.m. by Mayor Halliday
2. Public Comment -There were no public comments
3. Youth Commission Agenda Planning and Opportunities for Partnership: Zach Ebadi gave an introductory presentation to the HLAC members regarding opportunities for potential partnerships and reported on activities the Hayward Youth Commission has participated in over the past year.

Some of the discussion items for potential partnerships:

- open fieldtrip chaperone opportunities to other adult commissioners serving in City bodies, have census participation via youth commissioners and connection to mandatory community service,
  - get data regarding topics important to youth (drugs, alcohol, mental illness),
  - partner with Leadership Hayward, and
  - more funding for the Youth Commission, a second field trip, lunch, assist with survey incentives (gift cards etc.).
4. HUSD Strategic Plan Presentation:  
Dr. Wayne gave a presentation on the district's strategic plan it embarked on this past year. Dr. Wayne expanded the membership on the District Advisory Committee to include the Mayor and City Manager, parents, students, and staff.

Mayor Halliday shared her positive feedback as member of this planning process. City Manager McAdoo echoed the same sentiment and was surprised how the testing the students experience are not culturally relevant to Hayward students.

HARD expressed interest in having agencies combine or share strategic plans.

CM Marquez asked if there was a way to share the information on each other's website.

Dr. Carlson mentioned that youth/student mental health is an important issue that affects all three agencies.

5. Census 2020 Updates:

If 6% of the Hayward population was undercounted, we'd lose about \$100,000,000 in funding over 10 years. The three agencies discussed ways to encourage and ensure every resident is counted.

Hayward's timeline is below:

- October 1<sup>st</sup> presentation to City Council
- January – March 2020 will focus on generating awareness
- March – April 2020 will focus on motivating responses

Suggestion was made to have the three agencies hold census week, connect with youth commissioners to help inform their family and community to participate, and use other community events to educate the public regarding the importance of being counted.
